There are 8 teams who play in this League on a Tuesday afternoons from 13:00.At the end of the season the League holds a lunch and presentation event. Soft Plastic Recycling

The Co-op have introduced the recycling of soft plastics in 1500 of their stores across the UK. Most soft plastics cannot be recycled using Flintshire's kerbside recycling collection and so, up to now, will almost certainly have been thrown away in general waste and made their way into landfill. As we all endeavour to do our bit this is an important step and HKCC encourage everyone in the community to help by recycling their soft plastic waste. Three local stores, in Hope, Penyffordd and Broughton, offer a soft plastic recycling bin in-store.

What are soft plastics?

Soft plastics are lightweight plastics that often cannot be placed in recycling bins at home. Think plastic film lids on yoghurt pots, soft fruit punnets and ready meals, as well as plastic crisp packets, pasta bags and chocolate or biscuit wrappers. What they're not are plastic bottles, tubs, pots, trays and caps. If you're not sure, a simple test is to scrunch it up and if it pings back, it's a useful indicator it's soft plastic.

Soft plastics recycling is easy. Just follow these three steps:

- Clean it First, rinse your packaging out.
- Scrunch it Now, scrunch it up tight if it pings back, it's a useful indicator it's soft plastic.
- Co-op it Pop it into the soft plastics recycling unit at a Co-op near you.

Dog Fouling in Higher Kinnerton

HKCC members remain aware of dog fouling issues within the village. As part of measures to dissuade people from allowing their dogs to foul public areas we intend to provide a supply of dog waste bags that will be attached to lighting columns, at regular intervals around the village, and will regularly refill them.

However, there is one problem that is of particular concern and this relates to dog fouling with the Children's Play Facility down Park Avenue. We wish to remind residents that dogs are absolutely **NOT** permitted to enter this area

Not only is dog fouling disgusting, it also poses a significant health risk, and to children in particular. Dogs may deposit roundworm eggs (toxocara canis) in their faeces, which become infectious after about three weeks, and can remain so for up to two years. Anyone, but particularly children playing near to the ground, can run the risk of picking up and swallowing the eggs.

Toxocariasis is particularly hazardous to small children as it can result in blindness. Toxocara is the name given to a species of roundworm commonly found in dogs and cats. Virtually all puppies are born with toxocara. Puppies and kittens can also be infected with toxocara through their mother's milk or from environmental contamination.

Microscopic toxocara eggs are present in the faeces of infected animals. These eggs have thick, sticky shells which means that they can remain infectious in the soil for between two and four years after the faeces have disappeared. The sticky shell helps eggs to adhere to fingers or clothing.

Human infection comes from accidentally swallowing the infectious toxocara eggs. This is why crawling babies and toddlers are most at risk as they tend to put dirty fingers and toys into their mouths. Medical records show that approximately 100 new cases of Toxocariasis are diagnosed each year.

Once swallowed toxocara eggs release larvae into the intestine. These larvae travel through the body until they die, which may take several years. The symptoms of this disease can be unpleasant and difficult to treat. They can include stomach upset and pain, headache, sore throat, wheezing and listlessness. In some cases, larvae reach the eyes where they can cause sight problems and in some cases blindness.

Given the above can we please ask everyone to be aware and ensure that they look after their dogs and the community. Thank you


