Big Butterfly Count

Have you noticed there seems to be a lot of large white butterflies fluttering around the garden at the moment? Well, we had the Big Garden Birdwatch back in January and now it's time for the Big Butterfly Count! Launched in 2010, the Big Butterfly Count is a nationwide citizen science survey, the results of which will be used to assess the health of our environment since butterflies are an indicator species for biodiversity.

This year's **Big Butterfly Count** started on the 15th July but it's not too late to join in – you've got until the 7th August to download the identification chart or App and to start counting the butterflies. Just choose a comfortable spot, watch for 15 minutes and record all the butterflies you see. You can submit your results via the website (https://bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org/) or via the Big Butterfly Count App on your phone

Martin King's LEJOG challenge ride

In the first two weeks of August our very own councillor Martin King will be tackling the iconic UK cycle tour ride, namely the Lands End to John O'Groats challenge (LEJOG). Martin takes up the story.

"This will be a challenge like no other for me. Yes, I have done plenty of challenge rides over the years



and yes, I have ridden in the Alps, the Pyrenees, the Dolomites and the Welsh mountains. But riding for two weeks, day after day, on a hard saddle in good old British weather promises to be something altogether different. To make it worth my while Helen, my wife, has persuaded me to turn the ride into a fundraising effort (for which I simply have to provide the leg power and turn the pedals, all the hard admin work will be Helen's). As a result I will be riding to raise funds for Dial West Cheshire, a local charity which provides services and support for members of the community with disabilities. She has even set up a JustGiving page so that any of you who feel so inclined can easily make a small donation (or indeed a large one if you feel especially generous) which will go some way to making all my suffering worthwhile. I hope to provide updates throughout the ride using the hashtag #lejog4dial, both on Facebook and also on Strava. I am hoping to post about each day's experience on Facebook so



please feel free to like the page (just search for #lejog4dial) and keep up to date with how I'm getting on. And please do help out and keep me company during the trip, I promise I will do all the hard work and all you have to do is enjoy it from the comfort of your sofa. What could be easier?"

- The role will oversee the month to month finances, which are pretty simple.




