

# **Higher Kinnerton Pollinator Gardens Competition 2023**

Following on from last year's pollinator gardens competition in the village the Community Council are running a similar competition again this year. The aim of the competition is threefold – to encourage people to attract birds, bees and butterflies into their gardens, to add a splash of colour to our gardens, and to enjoy your gardens. The format this year will be similar, with our councillors taking time to walk round the village in July looking at front gardens. Obviously some of you won't have front gardens or might prefer to concentrate on your back garden, in which case it's easy – just get in touch with us in July and let us know about your garden. Don't worry if you forget, we will remind you via the newsletter and Facebook nearer the time. As last year there will be a prize of a Grosvenor Garden Centre Gift Voucher for the

To help get you started we have a number of pollinator flower seed packets to give away to residents on a first-come-first-served basis. There are two types of seeds, one specifically for bees and the other for butterflies, with a variety of flowers in each. We do require anyone taking a packet to enter the competition, and the seeds are only available for Higher Kinnerton residents. If you would like one of these packets to get you going they are available now from either Liz or Jason (contact details below).

There should be plenty of time to sow your seeds, plant out the seedlings and watch them grow. The plants should be flowering by the summer, ready for our team to wander round and see for



themselves how good they look. Even if you don't wish to take advantage of the seed packet give-away, we would still love you to enter the competition and show off your gardens – the more the merrier. It will all help Higher Kinnerton to be a brighter more colourful place and, of course, the bees and butterflies will love it!

# **Biodiversity Blog: March**

Springtime sees the arrival of the early butterflies such as peacock and small tortoise shell, along with queen bees and hedgehogs waking from their winter hibernation. Help the hedgehogs by leaving suitable food out for a few weeks to help them build up strength after the long winter sleep.

If you have ever found a bee on the pavement limp and lifeless you can also help them too. Sometimes bees just get hungry and exhausted but with a little sugar solution we can revive them and help them on

their way. Worker bumble bees only live for a few weeks so in peak summer they may just be at the end of their life span, at this time it's best to just place them on a flower just in case. If its early or late in the season and there is not an abundance of nectar filled flowers around a quick fix of sugar solution can act like CPR to a tired bee. In spring a light solution is recommend of 1 part sugar to 2 parts water and in autumn reverse it to 2 parts sugar to one part water. Pick the bee up gently, don't be afraid they rarely sting, bring them indoors and place them on a plate and add a drop of the sugar solution close by. If you can, add



some flowers such as grape hyacinth, dandelions etc to the plate so that once the sugar solution revives them, they can feed on some nutritious nectar. Once you see that they have perked up then take the plate outside so they can fly away when they are ready, and lastly, give yourself a pat on the back!

# **Higher Kinnerton Walking Group**

February's walk was a 6.2 km circular walk commencing at Caffi Dai in Shotton. The walk took us alongside the River Dee to the docks at Connah's Quay and then up along the old railway line into Wepre and then back into Shotton.

Bit of trivia: Did you know that the River Dee footpath is part of the 870 mile long Welsh Coastal Path and, when opened in 2012, was the first dedicated coast path in the world to cover the entire length of a country's coastline.

# Creation of more wildflower sites in Higher Kinnerton

Flintshire County Council (FCC) are currently delivering Local Places for Nature funding from the Welsh government to provide biodiversity improvements throughout the county. These improvements generally include tree-planting, wildflower meadow creation through seeding or reduced mow management to allow seeds already in the soil to germinate, pond creation etc.

FCC together with the Community Council have identified a number of sites for improvements within the village with designated wildflower planting areas in Park Avenue Play Area first being developed in 2022 with some fantastic results.

This Spring two more sites are being developed within Main Road Recreation Ground (marked in dark green) and the two existing sites in Park Avenue Play Area will also be enhanced with shade tolerant wildflower seed. All the wildflower areas will be left to grow throughout the Spring and Summer, with mown borders and visibility cuts maintained throughout this time period followed by a single cut, collect and removal of the cuttings in Autumn.

These areas provide important habitat for our pollinators, natural habitat steppingstones through settlements, and can improve the look and use of an area by the local community. They are also important in



helping us tackle the climate and ecological emergency. So, keep your eyes peeled for an explosion of colour this summer on these new mini meadows.
