


HIGHER KINNERTON SCARECROW COMPETITION 2023

JOIN IN THE FUN

The Village Hall and Bouncy Castles

The Trustees of the Village Hall have reluctantly and unanimously decided that they can no longer permit the use of Bouncy Castles or other inflatables at the hall. We have discovered that our Public Liability (P.L) insurance cover specifically excludes their use. Additionally, the insurers have informed us that they will **NOT** provide us with annual cover in this respect. Even if this was possible, one of the Trustees would have to attend each event to supervise the activity. We cannot guarantee to do this.

Many parents are under the mistaken impression that they are 100% covered by the Hiring company's own P.L policy when hiring equipment from them - this is very likely to be incorrect. We have recently researched several Hire companies, some of which have operated at the hall, who state in their websites that they are fully insured but, at the same time, "strongly advise" clients to take out their own P.L insurance. Why is this? It's very likely that their insurance cover only extends to your event on condition that one of their staff is present at the venue and is deemed competent to supervise it. This will usually entail an additional charge.

When you read the small print in their websites and especially when you check their conditions of hire, you may find statements like "We do not accept liability for any accident or injury" and they may ask you to sign a disclaimer absolving them from all responsibility. One company in this area, whilst stating in the FAQ's that they are fully insured, actually then states in their Conditions of Hire "We cannot be held responsible for what your children are doing when we are not there".

It is, of course, possible for you to arrange your own cover (£55 - £60 seems to be the norm), but you must also nominate a competent supervisor to the insurers and ensure the cover certificate is posted at the venue prior to and during your event. The venues may also require proof of insurance at least 7 days before an event. We are informed that commercial and Council-run leisure centres do allow Bouncy Castle parties that their own staff supervise.

We understand that parents will be disappointed with this decision and we will, of course, review it in the future.

Biodiversity Blog: April

April has usually warmed up enough to tempt bats out of their hibernation roosts and they will want to fill up and build up strength for their mating season in May. Spring is usually in full swing by April with plenty of shrubs and flowers coming to life and late April to early May heralds the return on some migratory birds including swifts.

You may also start to see ladybirds, aphids and other seasonal insects. To support biodiversity why not consider building a bug hotel in a quiet corner of your garden. Bug hotels can be built using a variety of materials, just use what is available to you.

It is important to find a good location/ area to build your bug hotel and to take into consideration the preferences of the insects you would like to attract (e.g. sunlight or damp conditions).

Your bug hotel should include several different layers such as:

- Dry leaves to mimic a forest floor so it's useful to include them at the bottom.
- Dead wood and bark are ideal for creepy crawlies like spiders, beetles, woodlice.
- Bamboo canes and other hollow stems are great for solitary bees (plastic straws are not suitable).
- Dry sticks, twigs and straw attract a variety of bugs such as ladybirds and beetles.
- Ventilation bricks provide useful shelter and protection from the elements.
- Rolled up wastepaper and corrugated cardboard for lacewings.
- Logs with holes drilled on the ends facing out are perfect for bees. If possible, lightly sand the holes to protect the delicate wings of the insects.

Bit of trivia - Birkenhead Park was designed by Joseph Paxton and opened on 5 April 1847 and is the oldest publicly funded park in the world. The park was the inspiration for Central Park in New York. It was designated a conservation area in 1977 and Grade 1 listed in 1995. The Park has many listed buildings including the Swiss Bridge and the Roman Boathouse and a modern visitor centre and cafe. Well worth a visit.



What's in Your Kitchen? by Jack Farrand

Hello, I'm Jack, Kinnerton's Local Repair Man. I'd like to take a moment to write about what you might not know about the companies that make your kitchen appliances, what to look out for and, rather than the initial experience reviews you're likely to get elsewhere, what you're likely to encounter long-term in my opinion. Hopefully my fellow Kinnertonites will benefit from the experience of a man who wrestles washing machines for a living!

The below is a brief and non-exhaustive list of the most prolific manufacturers of appliances for the UK Market, and a brief summary of their characteristics from the point of view of a repair man. All opinions are my own, and not those of Higher Kinnerton Community Council, and as always, your mileage may vary!



Whirlpool is an American company, and they contract for their machines to be made all over the world by different manufacturing firms. Their machines are, above all, inexpensive. Repairs are typically binary in nature, in that it is either a very simple and cheap repair, or the machine is written off. For example, door handles and main bearings on Whirlpool washing machines can fail, the former taking 20 minutes and under £100 to fix, the latter typically being far too extensive a repair on machines this cheap to buy new. I would not expect a recently purchased and well-used Whirlpool machine to reach 5 years old

without a repair of some form being required.



Although costly up-front, Bosch GMBH machines are well-made and stand up well to the test of time. Repairs can be expensive however, as cost-engineering has led Bosch to consolidate many parts into one, for example on their dishwashers; where the recirculation pump, temperature sensor and water heater are a single unit, more expensive than any of those parts would be individually. I typically encounter a fault when a Bosch machine is 8-12 years old, although this seems to be decreasing with newer machines.



Chinese conglomerate Haier is one of the lesser-known brands in Europe, despite their complete global dominance in volume sales of white goods over the past decade and a half. Their acquisition of Hoover/Candy, machines more commonly encountered in the UK, completed in September 2018. That means any major changes to the manufacturing quality have yet to reach the repair man so to speak, as the machines haven't had chance to fail! Existing Hoover/Candy Machines are generally well made, with principal failures being washing machine belt pulleys and general circuit boards, the former being a simple fix,

the latter being an expensive repair that requires careful consideration. I typically encounter these failures after 3-6 years.



Electrolux have established themselves in Europe as a manufacturer capable of a broad range of quality and expense across their entire range, although from a repair man's perspective the two do not always correlate! Electrolux-made fridges, freezers and ovens are some of the most budget-friendly and long-lived I have encountered, whereas the AEG built in combination ovens (sometimes also sold under the whitelabel Lamona) are my main source of microwave repairs, where the Magnetrons inside can fail in less than 3 years. For these ovens, which are commonly sold in new-build properties or through

fully-supplied kitchens and cost between £600 and £1,000 new, the component and design quality does not match the price in my opinion!

There are many other manufacturers, Korean giants LG and Samsung come to mind, and hyper-expensive but unbelievably well-made Miele machines as well, but to keep this short I'll reserve comment for another time. As always, I'm happy for you to call me if you need your appliances repaired or just want some advice.

Growing sunflowers

For those of you who are growing sunflowers this summer using the seeds provided by HKCC there are some handy hints below.

Planting sunflower seeds

Sow sunflower seeds from April to May, individually in pots of peat-free, multi-purpose compost. Sow one seed per 7.5cm-10cm pot. Push the seed 1.5cm into the compost and water in. Cover pots with a clear plastic bag and place in a cool but bright place. Gently give them a small amount of water each day, don't let them dry out. If they have flourished you may need to move them to a bigger pot. The first shoots should begin to appear in one to two weeks. Plant out into the garden when all risk of frost has passed, from late May to early June.



Where to grow sunflowers

Sunflowers need sun. They do best in fertile soil in a sheltered spot but will also do well in containers. However, if you want your sunflower to grow really tall, it's best to plant it in the ground. Prepare soil by removing weeds and add plenty of organic matter. Plant the sunflowers at the same depth they were in the pot. Water well and stake plants with a bamboo cane or similar.



Caring for sunflowers

Annual sunflowers need plenty of water. Feed them with tomato feed just before flowering. Don't allow plants to dry out as very tall varieties will have a job to recover. Very tall varieties may need the support of a garden cane – especially when growing in an exposed position. After flowering, leave the faded flower head intact so the birds can feast on the seeds.
