Creating a Wildlife Pond in Your Garden

Did you know that in the last 50 years about one third of UK ponds have disappeared, having a big impact on wildlife particularly amphibians. Higher Kinnerton is historically in an area with a large number of Great Crested newt breeding sites but these have declined over recent years.

Frogs, toads and newts need ponds to breed but spend much of their life in the areas surrounding the

ponds. There are 3 types of newts in the UK, the Smooth Newt, the Palmate Newt and the Great Crested Newt (known as the warty newt!). The smooth newt is the UK's most common newt. They can grow to 10cms and are generally brown in colour. Males develop a continuous wavy crest along their back in the breeding season. The belly of both sexes is yellow/orange with small black spots. The spots on the throat identify the smooth newt from the palmate newt (which lack spots on their throat). Our biggest newt, growing up to 17cm, is the great crested newt which is almost black in colour, with spotted flanks and a striking, orange belly. It has



warty skin and males have a long, wavy crest along the body and tail during the breeding season. They live for 6-15 years.

Adults are found in ponds in the breeding season and into summer (February to June). The spawn is laid as individual eggs, each wrapped in a leaf of pond weed. Unlike the tadpoles of frogs or toads, newt larvae develop their front legs before their back legs. They breathe through feathery external gills sprouting from the back of their heads. They leave water in late summer after losing their gills. They eat invertebrates either on land or in water even eating frog tadpoles. Outside the breeding season they are found on land in damp places, such as under logs, stones or leaf matter.

Dragonflies and damselflies also use water throughout their lifecycle. Dragonfly larvae (nymphs) can spend months or even years living in water. Once the nymph is fully grown, and the weather is right, it will complete the metamorphosis into a dragonfly by crawling out of the water up the stem of a plant. The nymph will shed its skin onto the stem of the plant and will then be a young dragonfly. The skin that the nymph left behind is called the exuvia and you can find it stuck to the stem. The adult only lives for 2 months.

Consider creating a wildlife pond in your garden! Once built the wildlife will come! It is best to leave out fish though as they outcompete amphibians and also prey on their eggs and larvae. The ponds do not need to be large and can even be made using a small container such as a washing up bowl. However, TAKE CARE where these are sited and consider mesh covers to prevent young children falling in. Please research properly on how to make a SAFE wildlife pond. There are numerous websites such as www.froglife.org or www.rspb.org.uk or www.wildlifetrusts.org.uk which provide advice and guidance on building a wildlife pond covering construction through to which plants to use and common mistakes. For example, don't use tap water to fill your pond as it contains chlorine or chloramines used to clean the water to make it potable for us (drinkable) but both of which are harmful to amphibians. Collect and use rainwater.

New Bus Service in Higher Kinnerton

We have received a message from Sarah Blake, Regional Transport Officer at Flintshire County Council who tells us that, following requests from residents of Higher Kinnerton, Cheshire West and Cheshire Council have conducted a timetable review of the 61, 61X and 62 bus services between Chester and Higher Kinnerton.

As of Sunday the 3rd of September, the new timetable will be introduced on a trial basis which includes some additional journeys that will terminate at Higher Kinnerton. Sarah has asked us to circulate this information with local residents through local publications and notices to ensure passenger patronage of the service and future sustainability of the revised timetable. It should be noted that there is no service on Sundays.

1st Kinnerton Scout Group


The whole Scout Group is saddened to hear of the death of June Worthington on Tuesday 15th August
