FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL STREET SCENE UPDATE

The Streetscene team at Flintshire County Council are responsible for services associated with streets, highways and open spaces. The Community Council regularly engages with the Streetscene team to assist with reporting and raising problems on behalf of residents such as potholes, dog fouling, blocked gullies ditches and drains and problems with roads and pavements.

The Streetscene team have advised the most effective way for residents to raise problems is to report them directly to Flintshire County Council by one of the following methods:

1st Kinnerton Scout Group are running a fundraising **Night at the Races** at the Village Hall on Saturday 2nd March. The doors will open at 7-30pm and the first race will be at 8-00pm.

It is quite a while since we have had a Race Night (thank you Covid!). The format will be the same as previously, but if you have never been to a similar event, let me explain:-

The 8 races of 8 horses each are specially filmed for a Race Night, and shown on the big screen. You can bet on each race. Each bet is £1 and you can bet on as many horses as you like. If your horse wins, you get your share of the winnings. To make the evening more interesting, you can become a Race Horse Owner for only £2. You can also **name your horse** on the race card. The Owner of the winning horse receives a prize.

We will also run a Tote Double during the night. This involves picking the winners of two races, but this will all be explained on the night.

Welcome to the Higher Kinnerton Heritage Trail

Many of you will recall that a couple of years back we reported on a project to develop a Heritage Trail walk round our lovely village. This ongoing project has now reached a point where we are able to introduce residents (and visitors) to the Trail and you can now access a map and information to follow it as it takes you on an historic tour of Higher Kinnerton.

Historically, Kinnerton consisted of a number of small hamlets which have grown together over time. The main settlement of Higher Kinnerton was Babylon, at the top end of Main Road, whilst Kinnerton Bridge was further towards Chester on

the English-Welsh border and Kinnerton Green lies to the west at the far end of Green Lane. As you follow the trail there are a number of sites of historic interest which provide pointers to this.

The walk is just under 2½ miles (3.9km) in length and should take between 60 and 90 minutes for most people. The terrain is generally easy underfoot and suitable for all ages.

We have produced an information poster introducing the Heritage Trail and providing a QR code which will allow smartphone users to access the Heritage Trail website. This website includes a map (which is also shown opposite) and directions on how to follow the Trail and what you can see along the route. The QR code is also shown here.

In addition we have added a Heritage Trail Quiz aimed at our younger

users and which will hopefully pique their interest by asking some questions about features along the Trail. The idea is to answer

the questions (there are 20 altogether) and any youngster who hands their answers in to the Council will receive a Quiz Completion pin badge. Please contact the Heritage Trail team via heritagetrail@higherkinnerton.org.uk with contact details and we can arrange this. There is a QR code on the Heritage

Trail website page to access the Quiz.

We hope to produce a Heritage Trail A4 leaflet in the coming months. In the meantime we aim to have the QR code poster available for scanning at various outlets through the village, including Walters and the shop, and all village noticeboards. There is also a link on the Higher Kinnerton Community Council website and it is possible to print a copy of the map from here. 

As well as directions the code gives historical information on some of the buildings and sights that you pass. It is safe and ideal for all ages with a modicum of care. The group enjoyed the walk and encourages people from the village is try it out. It is particularly recommended for any newbies to the Village.

A55 Road Closures (February and March)

Traffic Wales have given notice that due to planned roadworks around the J36 Warren Interchange on the A55 there will be a series of road and lane closures throughout February and March. Many of these closures will be overnight to minimise impact but there are some daytime closures too. As part of this

schedule and before the main work on the interchange starts they intend to repair and resurface the Broughton Retail Park exit and entry slip roads (J36A). This will start on January 26th. If you use either of these junctions on a regular basis then you should note the closures and plan an alternative route accordingly during the relevant dates. It is also likely that there will be unusually heavy traffic through Broughton and Bretton during these works.



The timetable briefly is as follows

J36A Broughton eastbound slip road closures will be over the weekend January 26-29 J36A Broughton westbound slip road closures will be over the weekend February 2-7 Main resurfacing works between J36 and J36A will be between February 11-23 Additional overnight closures between J35 and J38 between February 25 and March 3

Fill That Hole Update

Potholes on our roads are an increasing problem. They can cause damage and injury to all road users – motorists, cyclists, pedestrians. **Fill That Hole** is an online utility to report potholes and has recently undergone an update making it a little easier to report them and upload photographs. Whilst local councils have a statutory duty to repair a pothole they can only do so if they know about it. Fill That Hole will automatically forward any



defect you report to the relevant authority. The website is at https://www.fillthathole.org.uk/.
