* Additional information

We have been running the Baby and Toddler Group since September 2021. The sessions are co-ordinated by a group of eight amazing retired Kinnerton ladies, on a rota basis, who put a great deal of effort into delivering a nurturing, caring and fun event . We are registered with the Charity Commission and Early Years Wales. Each session is staffed by three of these volunteers who work on a rota basis and set up and take down the equipment, provide drinks and snacks and organise crafts and events.

For the first two years we received grants from Flintshire County Council as they were encouraging people to involve their children in the community following lockdown. Then one of our volunteers accessed the Shell Community Kindness grant scheme and secured funding in 2023 and 2024. These grants have enabled us to provide varied social and educational events and purchase equipment. Shell is no longer running this scheme and grant funding is hard to come by. We have increased our weekly fee by £1.

We think the crafts and events we provide are stimulating and enhance the experience for the children but we can only afford these if we receive grant money.

Subject: Bikers Events at the Royal Oak

I would like to draw the Community Council's attention to the Bikers night events that have been occurring every 2 weeks at the Royal Oak. I'm sure that these events bring in much needed revenue to the pub, however there are problems associated with them. Unfortunately the bikers appear to be disregarding the 20mph speed limit (and indeed the 40mph limit) on Kinnerton Lane. Not only that I suspect that some may also have altered their exhausts in order to make a more impressive noise when accelerating out of the village.

I wonder whether the Community Councils were notified about these events.

My husband, a biker himself in his younger days, went over to speak to the bikers to point out the speed limits and to warn them that Kinnerton Lane is actually a dangerous road that has been the scene of several accidents in recent years. At the time they appeared to take on board what he had said. However they now seem to have forgotten the advice given regarding speed.

One of our neighbours went to speak to the people running the Royal Oak about the noise and the speeding of the bikers. Unfortunately she was apparently met with a less than courteous reply.

I have reported these biker events to the police. Whether they will do anything to enforce the speed limit remains to be seen.

Is there anything that the Community Council can do about this, or is this another example of the law being flouted that we just have to accept.

Consultation to renew Alcohol Control and Dog Control Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO) in Flintshire, 24 June 2026 to 31 July 2026

I write to inform you that a consultation concerning Flintshire's Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) has commenced.

PSPOs are interventions to prevent individuals or groups committing anti-social behaviour in public spaces. These powers were introduced as part of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

Councils may grant a PSPO after consultation with the Police, the Police and Crime Commissioner and appropriate community representatives. They can be enforced by council officers, police officers or suitably authorised police community support officers. At present, there are two PSPOs in place in Flintshire which relate to dog control and the consumption of alcohol.

PSPOs can last for a maximum of three years before a review is required. As part of the statutory process we are now conducting a consultation on the current orders. Below is a brief outline of the prohibitions associated with the Dog Control and Alcohol Control Orders:

Dog Control PSPO

The Dog Control PSPO requires dog owners to:

- Remove their dogs' waste from all public places within Flintshire;
- Have with them a suitable means of collecting and disposing of dog waste;
- Place their dog on a lead when asked by an authorised officer, if the dog was causing a nuisance;
- Prohibit dogs from entering the playing areas of public marked sports pitches, formal recreation areas including but not exclusively bowling greens and tennis courts, fenced equipped children's play areas and all areas within school grounds;
- Keep their dog on a lead in cemeteries; and
- Prohibit the access of dogs in specified locations in the county; at present these areas are The Rosie, Wepre Park, Connah's Quay, and Mold Memorial Gardens (also known as the Ornamental or Flower Gardens, Mold).

Alcohol PSPO

The Alcohol Control PSPO allows police officers the power to request members of the public to surrender alcohol if a member of the public is believed to be causing a nuisance in a public place. This is not a total alcohol ban in public areas and is not applicable to licensed premises.

Any local authority that has a PSPO in place, may extend the period for which it has effect, if it is satisfied, on reasonable grounds, that doing so is necessary to prevent an occurrence or recurrence of the activities identified in the Order.
